With your support B-Lines will create a network of wildflower-rich routes, providing important habitat for bees, butterflies and other insect pollinators, enabling wildlife to move across the landscape, and making local areas more attractive for people to live and work in.

What are B-Lines?

B-Lines are a network of routes running through our countryside and towns linking together the best of our existing wildlife sites. Over time, and with your help, we will join these sites up by 'filling' the B-Lines with new wildflower-rich areas.



What is happening?

Buglife has mapped B-Lines across large areas of the UK and is working with local communities, councils, businesses, landowners and farmers to restore and create wildflower-rich areas across this network. To find out more and to see what is happening on the ground visit:

- If you live or work in the B-Lines why not help bees, butterflies and other pollinators by planting more wildflowers and shrubs
- Contact your council to see what they are doing to help pollinators, and encourage them to use areas of local parks and other land to create wildflower meadows
- Encourage your children to ask their school teachers to help them explore the world of insect pollinators. Ask them to create flower-rich areas in their school grounds
