Your local utilities company or local large businesses may have funding streams to support local projects through their Corporate Social Responsibility programmes.

## Local authorities

They may have funds designed to benefit local communities, sometimes provided via new developments. Your local authority may also have a specialist grants officer who can help to advise on sourcing funding.

#### Lottery funding

### Grant-giving trusts

Grants are often made from charitable trusts which might fund projects in a particular area or under a particular theme. Use the internet and local authority grant advisors to source these trusts.
