About Us

Buglife is the only charity in Europe dedicated to the conservation of all invertebrates. We are actively working to save our planet's rarest little animals, everything from bees to beetles, worms to woodlice and jumping spiders to jellyfish.

For almost 25 years, we have worked tirelessly to save the small things that run the planet. Invertebrates are vitally important to a healthy planet – humans and other life forms could not survive without them. The food we eat, the fish we catch, the birds we see, the flowers we smell and the hum of life we hear, simply would not exist without bugs. Invertebrates underpin life on earth and without them the world's ecosystems would collapse.

Buglife's mission has never been more important. The results from our Bugs Matter survey show that that the number of flying insects sampled on vehicle number plates, across the UK, has fallen by a staggering 63% between 2021 and 2024. The consequences of this have the potential to be far-reaching, not only impacting the health of the natural world, but affecting so many of the essential services that nature provides for us.

Our aim is to halt the extinction of invertebrate species and to achieve sustainable populations of invertebrates.

Our work spans many areas of focus including restoring nature, species recovery, education and awareness raising, campaigning and saving important invertebrate sites from development.

For a small charity, we make a big impact and work across the UK, Europe and internationally. Some of our biggest

achievements to date include:

- Issuing the <u>Bristol Declaration</u> on insect declines, supported by over 80 organisations and high-profile individuals.
- Establishing our award-winning <u>B-Lines</u> initiative which aims to create and restore at least 150,000 hectares of connected wildflower-rich habitats across the UK, with over 500 hectares delivered by our projects alone so far.
- Successfully campaigning to have <u>neonicotinoid pesticides</u> banned across Europe.
- Fine-scale mapping 70 <u>Important</u>
 <u>Invertebrate Areas</u> across the UK,
 allowing us to better understand where
 our most threatened species and
 assemblages live.
- Establishing 22 river monitoring groups across Scotland and delivering training to over 700 people as part of our <u>Guardians</u> <u>of our Rivers</u> project.

- Ensure long-term financial sustainability through strong governance, risk management, and compliance.
- Drive innovation in financial systems and processes, supporting digital transformation and data-driven decision making.
- Develop a high-performing finance team, nurturing leadership capability and building resilience for the future.

Key Responsibilities

Strategic Leadership

 Lead strategic financial management planning and control in collaboration with SLT and the Board of Trustees.

- As a member of the Senior Leadership team work in partnership with the Board to deliver Buglife's strategy.
- Support the Co-leaders and the wider SLT during the Transformation journey that we are about to embark upon.
- Attend Board meetings and present financial papers with clear recommendations.
- Support the Board of Trustees in the discharge of their financial responsibilities including maintaining a suitable level of charity reserves.
- Support the effective operation of Finance working group.
- Contribute to wider board discussions.

Budget Setting

- Coordinate the annual budget setting process in collaboration with the Senior Leadership Team.
- Prepare a three-year rolling budget for the organisation which reflects our ambitious business strategy whilst ensuring that the budget is realistic and affordable.

Managing Finance

- Maintaining an overview of the charity's finances.
- Implementing and integrating finance systems and processes to make sure we remain efficient and up to date.
- Ensuring that the charity is compliant with all relevant finance, taxation and accounting legislation, guidelines and best practice.
- Ensuring that the charity has sufficient financial resources to meet its obligations and adhere to its reserves policy.
- Taking all reasonable steps to minimise the risk to charity from fraud and financial mismanagement.
- Ensuring that all expenditure and commencement of work is legitimate and properly authorised.
- Managing the charity's bank accounts and, with reference to the Co-Leaders ensuring that financial resources are invested according to the charity's policies.
- Liaising with managers and Buglife's accountants to ensure that salary payments are correct and timely.
- Have knowledge and understanding of charity trading arms and the VAT and other considerations of its ongoing operation.
- Ensuring that proper financial prudence is exercised by staff, contractors and others connected with the charity.

Monitoring Finances

 Ensuring that accounts and records of income, expenditure and budgets are

- based on accurate information, enabling their maintenance to a recognised accounting protocol and subjected to audit and compliant with the requirements of funders and regulators.
- Overseeing financial management of projects in collaboration with the Projects Manager/s, maintaining accounts and budgets for projects, or ensuring that these are maintained by others to common standards and formats and there is clarity about project income and expenditure budgets.
- Monitoring actual project income and expenditure against forecast and identifying any potential issues early on.
- Maintaining and developing the full cost recovery processes.

Reporting Finances

- Liaising with the Treasurer to produce accurate and timely Annual Accounts and coordinating the successful independent auditing of the accounts.
- Keeping the Senior Leadership Team informed of significant financial issues and developments both internally and externally.
- Ensuring that up-to-date, sufficiently detailed management accounts and financial metrics measures are presented to the Senior Leadership Team and the Board of Trustees.
- Innovating new ways of presenting finances to stakeholders.
- Presenting finance and funding updates regarding Buglife projects as required.
- Submitting accounts, reports and other information to the Charities Commission, OSCR, Companies House, ENTRUST and other regulators, on time.

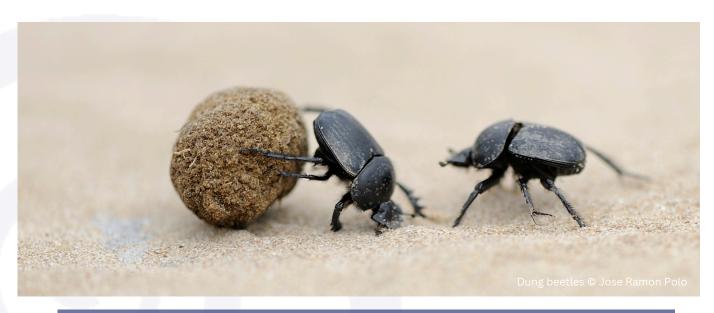

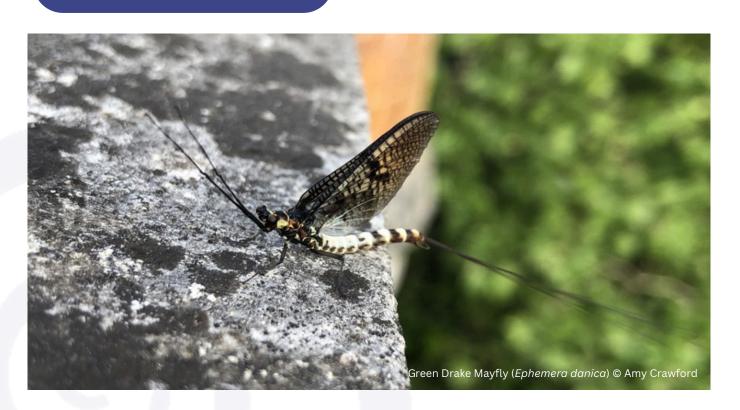
